THE SEASON SO FAR...

THE 2022-23 SEASON IS NORTHAMPTON TOWN WOMEN'S FIRST CAMPAIGN IN THE FOURTH TIER.

It comes after the Cobblers' unbeaten East Midlands Women's Regional Football League Premier Division title winning campaign, which included a Northamptonshire FA Women's Cup final victory over Peterborough United.

Northampton's historic FA Women's National League Division One Midlands campaign began at home to Wem Town. A healthy crowd were in attendance at Harpole FC for the Cobblers' first fixture at this level, but they were left disappointed by an uncharacteristic performance which saw their team beaten 4-1. Bianca Luttman's long-range free-kick was

one of few positives to take from the contest.

The result was a wake-up call for the Cobblers, who realised they would need to adapt quickly to their new surroundings in a higher division. They put in a much-improved performance away to Leek Town the following week, but were unable to take their chances and came away with a 2-0 defeat.



Northampton earned their first FAWNL point as goals from Alex Dicks, Kim Farrow and Abbie Reboul rescued a 3-3 draw from a trip to Leafield Athletic just three days later, but any celebrations were cut short at the weekend as Stourbridge visited Harpole FC and came away with a 2-1 win. Favour Omenazu scored the hosts' goal.



After a two-week break, the Cobblers welcomed Sheffield FC to Northamptonshire, still in search of their first victory in the fourth tier. They were dominant throughout, hitting the woodwork multiple times, but the visitors took one of their limited chances to snatch a narrow 1-0 win.









Things did not get any easier for Northampton as they came up against last season's FAW Championship promotion play-off losers Wolverhampton Wanderers in the FAWNL Cup determining round the next week. Wolves were ruthless in the first half at Spencer Community Trust FC, going in at the break with a 5-0 lead, but the Cobblers showed great resilience to create numerous opportunities and restrict their opponents to non-threatening half-chances in the second period.



It has finally started to click for Northampton in recent weeks, a dominant and thoroughly deserved 7-0 win over Long Eaton United in a fourth consecutive home game securing a long-awaited first three points at level four. Dicks scored a hat-trick, Luttman took her tally for the season to three and Mia Richards and Gracie Williams netted the other goals.

The Cobblers went into their meeting with rivals Peterborough full of confidence on the back of a comfortable 3-0 win in the FAWNL Plate preliminary round away to Sheffield at the weekend. Omenazu, Dicks and Farrow bagged for the Town as they made up for their recent loss against the same opponents. It was a similar match to the league defeat, but this time they were clinical and gave Sheffield no chance to cause an upset.

Dicks added a spectacular 50th goal in all competitions for the first team away to the Posh the following Wednesday, but a late equaliser from the hosts meant her side had to settle for a frustrating derby point.



The Cobblers' last two matches were cup ties, a trip to EMWRFL Premier Division side Lincoln United in the Vitality Women's FA Cup third qualifying round a fortnight ago before an FAWNL Plate first round fixture at home to today's opponents Lincoln City. If they progress in those two competitions, Josh Oldfield and Liam Williams' side will be unbeaten in five games ahead of this afternoon's contest.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS LINCOLN CITY WOMEN



Lincoln City Women FC is an English women's football club affiliated with Lincoln City FC. The club play in the FA Women's National League North and play their home games at Lincoln Moorlands Sports & Social Club

Lincoln City Women FC has evolved over the period of time since the club's inception in 2008. They started life as Nettleham Ladies FC and entered the Lincolnshire County Women's League in the same year. In 2009, the club won the Lincolnshire County Women's League and were promoted to East Midlands Women's Football League Division One North, where they remained until 2012.

For the start of 2012/13 season they gained promotion as league champions and were promoted to the East Midlands Women's Football League Premier Division, where they competed until 2017/18 season. They clinched the title by three points, losing just one game all season. The season ended with a 7-0 victory over Grimsby Borough in the County Cup Final.





Another title winning season was followed by their first season at Tier Four of the women's football pyramid in 2018/19 and they have continued to dominate the Lincolnshire Women's Senior County Cup by winning it in each of the last six seasons.

The summer of 2019 was a landmark in the development of the Club as a successful name change to Lincoln City Women FC meant a total rebranding for the 2019/20 season and a change of Club colours to the famous red and white stripes.

This season the side have had mixed fortunes winning two, drawing one & losing three of their six league games to date, placing them 8th in the league. Last weekend they were knocked out of the Vitality Women's FA Cup but remain in the FA WNL Plate where they face The Cobblers next veekend.

PRIDE AT PREPARING FUTURE LIONESSES

Some of the Future Lionesses may now come from Northamptonshire thanks to the FA's new, county-wide development programme for elite female footballers and a successful 3 year licence to run an ETC in the County.



The FA Emerging Talent Centre's (ETC) were launched in July, with the aim to increase the number of young female players engaged in Football Association programmes across England by the end of the 2023-24 season.

Northamptonshire's ETC is hosted by the Northampton Town FC Community Trust in partnership with The University of Northampton and supported by the Northamptonshire Football Association. Female ETC players from across the County, will have access to the same top-level support and development opportunities as their male peers.

This covers everything they need to support them to reach their full potential in the game, with access to quality and experienced Northampton Town FC Community Trust coaches, state-of-the-art training facilities & the chance to learn and develop in the ETC programme in addition to playing grass roots football. They will also have professional advice, testing & training at the University's Waterside campus, thanks to the partnership between University staff and will be developed on the pitch thanks to the coaching programme set out by the NTFC Community Trust.

Thanks to the holistic approach to the player development encouraged by the ETC programme players will also be educated and supported off the pitch. Informed by research and led by members of the UON Sports Science team, this will include sessions on sport psychology, nutrition, and each ETC member will also have access to strength, conditioning and performance testing. As well as the opportunity to receive further injury rehabilitation support in the University's Sports Rehabilitation and Conditioning Clinic .



The first group of players have been recruited through a trial period. Last week they were officially welcomed with their

families to an induction event at UON's Waterside campus, with talks about the programme and a tour of the UON facilities they'll have access to. We cannot wait to get started & watch these girls flourish!
